8AM-9AM Photo opportunity, Macro Photography, Nature Scenes

Pleasant Run Parkway not the same as Pleasant Run Park located nearby
Parking for the Parkway is located directly across from the Pulaski Fire Station
117 E. Madison St, Pulaski, TN 38478

Walk along a paved nature rail, which runs along a creek. Located just one block from the courthouse with parking less than 100 feet from the paved trail, Pleasant Run is a 1.5 mile long trail which runs north to south just east of the downtown district. Wild flowers, blue herons and other wildlife are often spotted along this picturesque trail.

Jeff covers various aspects needed to achieve the “perfect portrait”. From single strobe to outdoor venue using a reflector, learn from the best! This session will allow for some attendees to use their cameras to “shoot with a pro”. You can put this workshop to use later the same day at Antoinette Hall Opera House.

Get the best images possible from you iPhone or smart phone camera. Learn to use your iPhone in the same manner as professional photographers use their DSLRs. Includes the use of third party apps to take advantage of the iPhone camera’s great capabilities.

1:00-2:30 Workshop C: Photoshop Essentials by Jeff Roush

Learn the absolute essentials needed by photographers, using Photoshop to get the most out of their images.

3:00-5:30 Photography in Antoinette Hall Opera House

Photograph one or all of the eight rustic side rooms and the 150 year old opera house hall. Bring your on or off camera lights or use some of the available studio light setups. Wired and wireless triggers will be available, or bring your own complete system. If you would like to put your light setup inside the hall in the morning prior to the workshops, just let Doug know, he can make it happen. A models will be available for poses or just shoot the 1868-1930 era building as it is today, tripods recommended!
